CENTRAL REGION HIGHLIGHTS

- Central Region has recorded 780 suspected cases
- 780 specimens have been taken for testing
- 301 negative results received
- 471 results pending
- 8 positive cases confirmed
- 1 imported case from GA, making a total of 9 cases

KEY PUBLIC HEALTH ACTIONS

Coordination

• A team from RPHEMC and University of Cape Coast Authorities led by the Honourable Regional Minister paid a visit to the Vice President of Ghana, Dr. Bawumia at Jubilee house to discuss the implementation of COVID testing centre at UCC to reduce delays in receiving test results. In attendance were Dr. Nsiah Asare and Director General of GHS, Dr. Patrick Aboagye.



 Contact tracing is on-going and additional 148 new specimens have been taken, 130 through enhanced surveillance, 18 through routine surveillance. These have been sent for testing


Point of Entry


• Enhanced surveillance is on-going along our coastal lines. One hundred and forty-eight (153) returnees are under mandatory quarantine for 14 days in a safe and secured location. Their initial samples have been taken and sent for testing


Case Management

• The positive cases are receiving treatment and they are stable

The Region is mobilizing more PPEs for distribution to all facilities.







Risk communication

- Engagement of our fisher folk and opinion leaders in the fishing areas on COVID-19 education has been initiated and on-going
- Daily radio discussions on-going by the risk communication team
- Information Service department continuous education in the facilities and communities.


Logistics




Figure 1: Summary of suspected cases of COVID-19 Central region, 21 Apr 2020




Figure 2: Positive status of confirmed cases of suspected Codvid-19 Central Region, 22nd April 2020




Figure 3: Suspected COVID cases by Age and Sex Distribution
